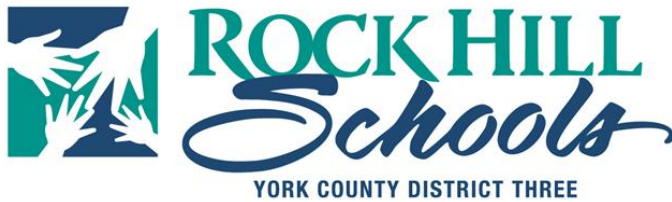

SUBJECT: Minority Business Report

In accordance with the requirements of the District Procurement Code, please find attached a Minority Business Vendors Report and the dollars spent with these vendors for the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

The District Procurement Code has as a **'goal'** that 10% of all procurable dollars be spent with State certified minority vendors. Please note that the attached report has a listing of certified as well as non-certified vendors. We have not met our goal for this year with certified vendors but have exceeded our goal with non-certified vendors.

The certification process with the State is cumbersome and few vendors choose to go thru the process, and some that have been certified in the past choose not to become re-certified, which is reflected in the attached report. The Procurement Office canvases the vendor community for minority vendors on a regular basis and encourages minority participation whether certified or not.

The Code requires that a copy of minority business activity be submitted to the Board of Trustees annually with the Procurement Audit.

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This summer, Little's Charlotte office hosted Shannon Higgins, a middle school teacher, and Rick Johnson, a high school teacher, from Rock Hill Schools just across the border in South Carolina. It was part of a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) Externship program that [Rock Hills Schools created](#) to put teachers into industry for a week. The teachers learn how we use STEM in our professions, and then take what they learn to craft lesson plans so that their students solve real world problems in the classroom.

The great part about Rick and Shannon coming to Little was we were able to provide a very diverse experience, not just in engineering, but architecture and technology too. They sat with electrical, mechanical, structural and civil engineers and learned about things like power distribution, energy modeling, roof trusses, and stormwater ponds. They sat with architects and learned about how we design schools and workspaces. And they saw how our digital media experts create fundraising and marketing videos as well as renderings that look just like photographs.
