4 TIPS TO PAY FOR COLLEGE

- ❑ **Fill out the FAFSA**
Receive federal grants, work-study opportunities, student loans and some state and school based aid
- ❑ **Search for Scholarships**
Find free money related to your hobbies and interests, civic involvement, immediate family member's military status, race or ethnicity, location, and your work history
- ❑ **Choose an affordable school**
Ask colleges about their scholarships and aid given to students. Also, transferring from a 2 Year to 4 Year schools can be very cost effective if you stay in-state
- ❑ **Federal Loans**
Given through the FAFSA, federal loans come with benefits like Income based repayment plans and loan forgiveness

FAFSA-Free Application for Federal Student Aid Application opens soon!!

- ✓ SENIORS!!! Complete the FAFSA application to qualify for grants and scholarships from the government
- ✓ Students who don't complete the FAFSA leave behind billions of dollars in unclaimed federal Pell Grant Money
- ✓ Parents—You will use your prior-prior tax year information to fill out your part of the FAFSA
- ✓ It's *free to apply* and the earlier you apply the more money available. Submit your FAFSA application by 03/01/2022 for greatest consideration
