COURSE SELECTION

Students and parents meet with their assigned counselor each year to discuss post-secondary plans, career goals, and course selection.

Consider the below items when choosing course requests:

These are requests, NOT a schedule.

Please note that the courses you are selecting at this time are just requests. Actual student schedules will not be created until summer and are typically released to students in late July/early August.

Courses may not be able to be scheduled if overall requests are low, a teacher is not available to teach the class, or there is a conflict with other courses you have requested.



GENERAL INFORMATION

- Rising 9th, 10th and 11th grade students should select 8 units of courses to include an English, math, science, and social studies class and electives.
- School of Choice students must select/enroll in a STEAM Pathway course.
- **Students must have prior approval before taking any Virtual SC, dual credit or dual enrollment courses. Only a select list of college dual enrollment courses are approved by Rock Hill Schools to receive dual credit (high school & college credit). Work with your counselor to discuss options and the process for doing so.**
- Student schedules are created for the entire school year in the summer prior to the start of the school year. Students should choose their course requests carefully; **once schedules are set changes are very limited and based on a strict set of guidelines.**
- Counselors may assign classes for students who do not complete the course selection process.

ADVANCED STUDIES PROGRAMS

ATTENDANCE

Attendance in your classes every day is important!!

If you miss too many days in a class, you can fail due to absences (FA). The FA will be recorded as your final grade even though you have a passing average.

- Students are only allotted 6 unexcused absences in a semester/per class (3 in a quarter class).
- **Students may only attend Make Up School to recover 4 absences/class (\$20 per session)**
- Absences documented with parent or medical notes are ***not*** excused absences, but these notes should be submitted to attendance to avoid truancy contact.

CONTENT RECOVERY

Students who are struggling in the classroom should ask their teachers for additional support. Students may be able to complete content recovery which helps to improve reporting period grades while students are still enrolled in a class.

For more information, students and parents should reach out to the classroom teacher.

CREDIT RECOVERY

Students who fail a class with a final grade of 50-59 in a core class may be able to participate in credit recovery. Participating in credit recovery allows students to recover credit for a failed class by completing assigned units in the Edmentum online curriculum.

- Participation in credit recovery does not remove a failing grade from a student's transcript and does not impact/improve a student's GPA.
- Students must clear any FAs before participating in credit recovery
- ***Note – The South Carolina High School League only allows 2 classes to be recovered per year for eligibility purposes.***

Parents and students should discuss the credit recovery option with the student's assigned counselor as needed.

HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

- Students must pass a specified # of classes each semester and year in order to be eligible for high school athletics (see page 14 in the 2023-2024 RHS Course Catalog).
- Fall/Winter sports eligibility is based on the previous school year's grades and spring sports eligibility is based on fall grades.

Note – Students may only apply 2 credit recovery and/or summer school classes toward eligibility.

- Consider your major and career goals
- What type of college do you want to attend?
 - 4-year, 2-year, Technical, Vocational

 - 11th & 12th graders are allowed to take 2 college visits. These absences will be excused with proper documentation.

Note – These are the general requirements for 4-year college entrance in SC schools. Parents and students are encouraged to research the specific admission requirements for schools of interest.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTS

PSAT – All 10th grade students take PSAT each year in October. This is a great opportunity for students to get practice. **11th grade students** can sign up to take the test.

ACT/SAT – We recommend college bound students begin taking ACT/SAT in the junior year. It is recommended that students have taken or be taking Algebra 2. Most colleges will accept either test. Students can take both tests to determine which is a better fit. **It is ideal for students to test 2-3 times prior to the senior year.**

Technical School Placement Test - Students who plan to attend a technical college may choose to take a placement test. Scores are used to determine proper course placement.

Note – Some technical college programs require SAT/ACT scores for admission.
