### **ATTENDANCE**

#### Attendance in your classes every day is important!!

If you miss too many days in a class, you can fail due to absences (FA). The FA will be recorded as your final grade even though you have a passing average.

- Students are allotted 6 unexcused absences in a semester class, 3 in a quarter class, and 10 in a yearlong class.
- Absences documented with parent or medical notes are <u>not</u> excused absences, but these notes should be submitted to attendance to avoid truancy contact.
  - Students may attend Make Up School to recover absences (\$20 per session)

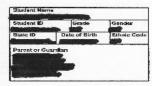

## **CONTENT RECOVERY**

Students who are struggling in the classroom should ask their teachers for additional support. Students may be able to complete content recovery which helps to improve quarter grades while students are still enrolled in a class.

For more information, students and parents should reach out to the classroom teacher.

## **CREDIT** RECOVERY

Students who fail a class with a final grade of 50-59 in a core class may be able to participate in credit recovery. Participating in credit recovery allows students to recover credit for a class by completing assigned units in the GradPoint online curriculum.

- Participation in credit recovery does not remove a failing grade from a student's transcript and does not impact/improve a student's GPA.
- Note The South Carolina High School League only allows 2 classes to be recovered per year for eligibility purposes.

Parents and students should discuss the credit recovery option with the student's assigned counselor as needed.

#### HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

- Students must pass a specified # of classes each semester and year in order to be eligible for high school athletics (see page 15 in the <a href="2022-2023">2022-2023</a> RHS Course Catalog).
- Fall/Winter sports eligibility is based on the previous year's grades and Spring sports eligibility is based on fall grades.

Note -

Students may only apply 2 credit recovery and/or summer school classes toward eligibility.

## **MILITARY EXPLORATION**

#### Are you interested in the military??

- Military service can be full-time or part-time... You can also consider attending college and military service.
- Begin talking to military recruiters about their branch of the military and entrance requirements.
- Take ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)... This test is offered at South Pointe each year to all 11<sup>th</sup> graders and 12<sup>th</sup> graders who sign up.
  - ASVAB Testing will take place in February 2023

## GOING TO COLLEGE?

- Narrow your top choices to 5-7 schools
  - Consider the type of school: 4-yr, 2-yr, Technical, Vocational
  - Research admission requirements, majors offered, campus size, extracurricular activities, etc.
- Campus Visits/Open Houses
  - Juniors are allowed 2 excused college visit days
  - Must bring verification of your attendance on the school letterhead to the SPHS Attendance Office within 5 days of the absence to be excused
- Take SAT/ACT/Accuplacer (as needed)
  - Fee Waivers available for SAT and ACT for those who qualify (contact Mr. Rogers in Guidance)

### **COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTS**


**PSAT** – All 10<sup>th</sup> grade students take PSAT each year in October. This is a great opportunity for students to get practice. 11<sup>th</sup> grade students can sign up to take the test. **This is the only test opportunity for 11<sup>th</sup> graders to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program.** 

**ACT/SAT** – We recommend college bound students begin taking ACT/SAT in the junior year. It is recommended that students have taken or be taking Algebra 2 Most colleges will accept either test. Students can take both tests to determine which is a better fit. **It is ideal for students to test 2-3 times prior to the senior year.** 

**Accuplacer** - Students who plan to attend a technical college may choose to take Accuplacer which is a placement test. Scores are used to determine proper course placement. **Note – Some technical college programs require SAT/ACT scores for admission.**

## 2-YR/TECHNICAL COLLEGE ADMISSION

- Accuplacer Placement Test
  - Offered @ York Tech Monday-Saturday
    - Check website for availability and more information https://www.yorktech.edu/departments/assessment-center/
  - No Fee (There may be a fee charged to send scores to another college)
  - SAT/ACT scores may be submitted instead of the placement test (some programs require SAT/ACT scores)
- GPA Students may be admitted without the placement test if they have a 3.0+ Cum GPA
- University Transfer Program
  - Ensure courses taken at the technical school will transfer

#### 4-YR COLLEGE ADMISSION

Students should research entrance requirements for schools they are interested in attending. Various factors are considered:

- Rigor of Courses
  - Schools may require specific coursework for admissions
  - Remember, 3 lab sciences (physical science is not a lab science), 2-3 units of foreign language, 1 unit of fine arts; CP level course work
- SAT/ACT Scores
  - Note: Many schools adopted a "test optional" policy during the pandemic, so students should check with their particular schools of interest to note what their policy will be for fall 2023
- GPA/Class Rank
- Extracurricular Activities/Community Service

## 4YR COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

English 4 Units

Math 4 Units (Algebra 1 (or the equivalent), Algebra 2, Geometry, 4<sup>th</sup> higher level math)

Science 3 Units Laboratory Science (Physical Science & Integrated Science are not lab sciences)

US History 1 Unit

US Government ½ Unit

Economics ½ Unit

Other Social Studies 1 Unit (World Geography or World History are strongly recommended)

World Language 2 Units (same language; Some schools may require 3 units)

Fine Arts 1 Unit

PE/JROTC/Band w/PE 1 Unit

(Computer Science is strongly recommended as well as courses in the above listed categories)

**Note** – These are the general requirements for 4-year college entrance in SC schools. Parents and students are encouraged to research the specific admission requirements for schools of interest.

### RESUME SAMPLE

#### Creating a High School Resume

#### A high school resume may be used for multiple reasons:

- Requesting a letter of recommendation
- Submitting with a college or scholarship application
- Applying for a job

#### The below information should be included in your resume:

- Name, Mailing Address, Phone #, Email Address
- Education (Current School, Grade Level, GPA, Class Rank)
- Post-Secondary Plans & Career Goals
  - o College Major
  - 1st choice college/university or top 3 choices (if applicable)
     Military Interest (if applicable)
- Extracurricular Activities (include grade level(s) of participation)
- Community Service (include timeframe, i.e. Summer 2020)
- Work Experience (include timeframe, i.e. Summer 2020-Present)
- Leadership Experience (i.e. Senior Class President, Varsity Soccer Team Captain, etc.)
- Honors and Awards (include timeframe, i.e. 2020-2021)
- Special Training, Skills, Certifications


#### Answers to the below questions would also be helpful:

- How would you describe yourself?
- What characteristic or quality has helped you to be most successful?
- What accomplishment are you most proud of and why?
- Describe any circumstance or situation in our life that has helped to shape your character, personality, and attitude towards life.
- What are 5 random things about yourself you would like me to know as I write your recommendation letter (you can provide more than 5)?

#### Any additional information not listed above is always welcomed!

#### Tips for requesting letters of recommendation...

- Ask someone who knows you well enough to speak to your academic ability and your personal character.
- Make your request well in advance of the deadline (2-3 weeks) and provide necessary information such as the reason for the recommendation, the deadline, how it should be submitted, etc.
- Provide a friendly reminder several days prior to the deadline if needed.



### RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

In addition to your resume, you may want to consider providing answers to these questions when requesting a letter of recommendation. This type of information is very helpful in writing a more personal recommendation letter.

Be sure to request recommendation letters at least two weeks in advance!!

- How would you describe yourself?
- What characteristic or quality has helped you to be most successful?
- What accomplishment are you most proud of and why?
- Describe any circumstance or situation in your life that has helped to shape your character, personality, or attitude towards life.
- What are 5 random things about yourself you would like me to know as I write your recommendation letter. Feel free to share more than 5 if you like.

## ADVANCED STUDIES PROGRAMS

South Pointe offers **Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and Dual Credit** courses. Review the RHS Course Catalog (pages 53-59) to learn more about these programs and course options.

NOTE – Students planning to take dual enrollment classes should meet with their counselor to discuss before enrolling as there is a Dual Enrollment contract that must be signed and approved by the Director of Secondary Instruction. In addition, only courses approved by Rock Hill Schools for dual credit may be added to a student's transcript for high school credit.

#### 2022-2023 RHS Course Catalog

The **Governor's School for Science & Mathematics Accelerate** program is also available at South Pointe. This is a virtual program geared toward students who demonstrate an exceptional ability in science and mathematics and have a strong interest in engineering and problem solving. Students must apply for admission to this program in 9<sup>th</sup> grade to begin participating in 10<sup>th</sup> grade. The application window typically opens November 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### **GENERAL COURSE SELECTION INFORMATION**

- **Rising 10**<sup>th</sup> **and 11**<sup>th</sup> **graders** should select 8 units of courses to include an English, math, science, and social studies class and electives. **Rising 12**<sup>th</sup> **graders** must select at least 6 units of courses. Please note that if late arrival (1<sup>st</sup> block) and/or early dismissal (4<sup>th</sup> block) do not work out in the schedule you will have to fill the slot with a class.
- Students must have prior approval before taking any virtual, dual credit or dual enrollment courses.
   Only a select list of college dual enrollment courses are approved by Rock Hill Schools to receive dual credit (high school & college credit). Work with your counselor to discuss options and the process for doing so.
- Student schedules are created for the entire school year in the summer prior to the start of the school year. Students should choose their course requests carefully; once schedules are set changes are very limited and based on a strict set of guidelines. **Counselors may assign classes for students who do not complete the course selection process.**
- Courses selected during the IGP meeting are requests, not a schedule.
