- I plan on attending Lander University. I have been accepted as an Early Childhood Education Major!





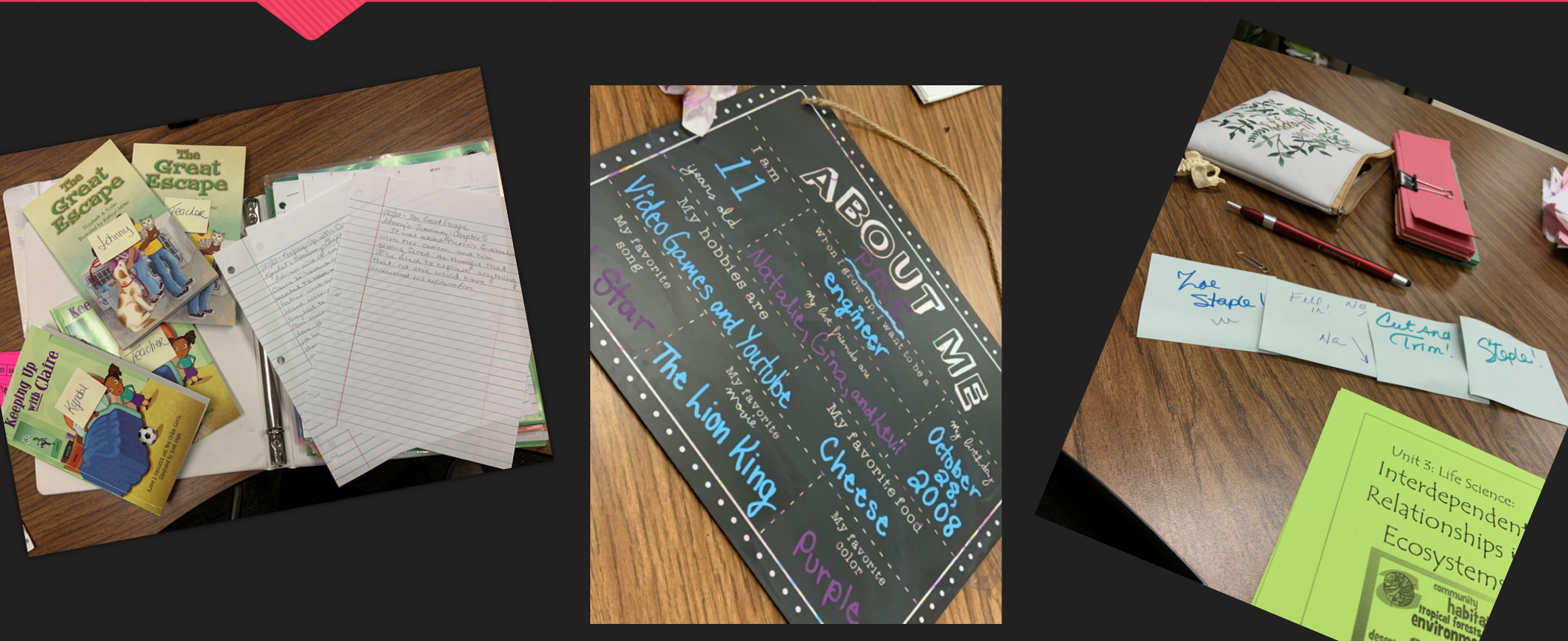
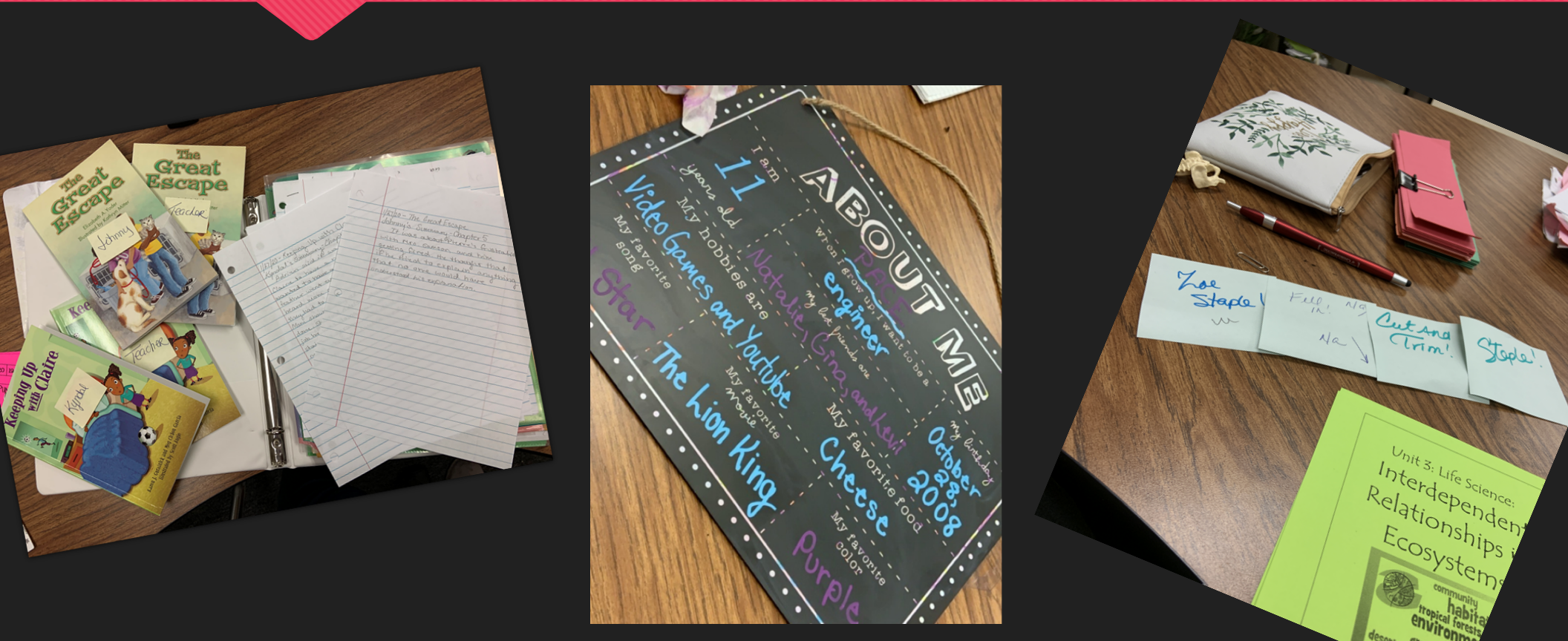
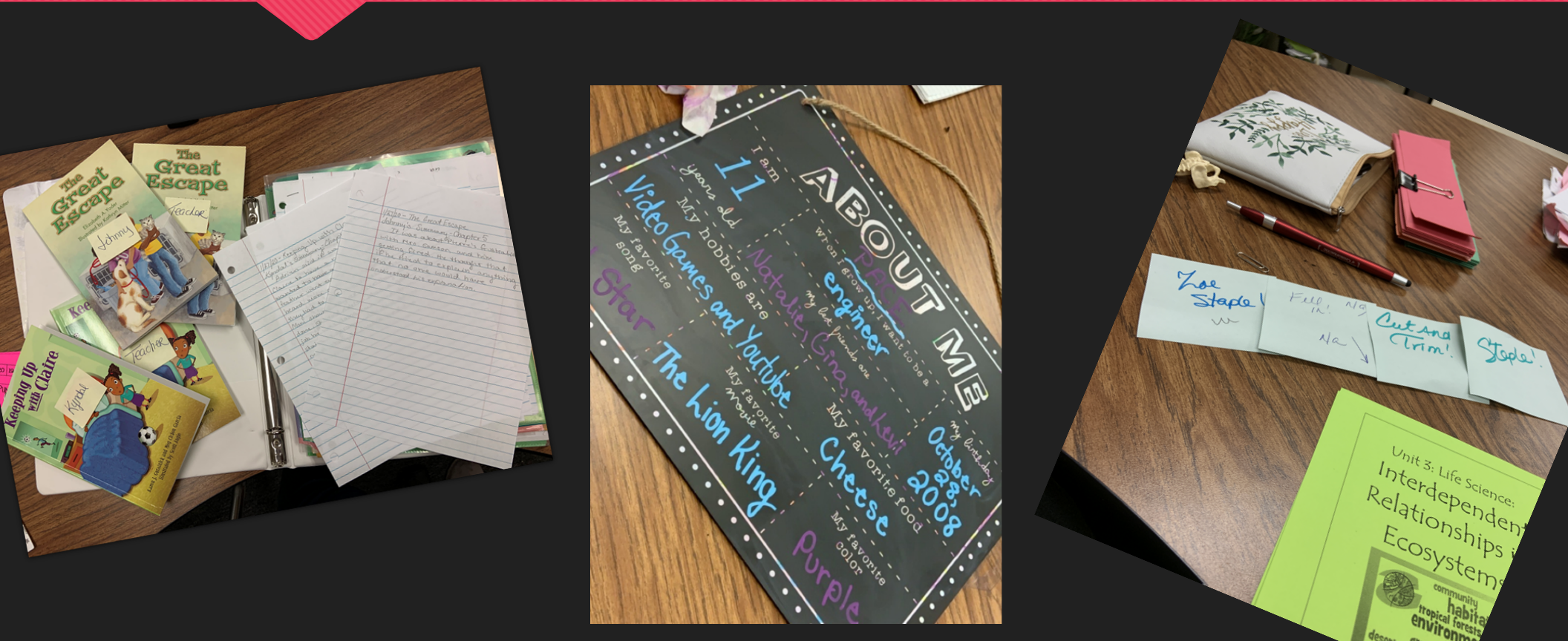
# Would I recommend ATC? And Why?

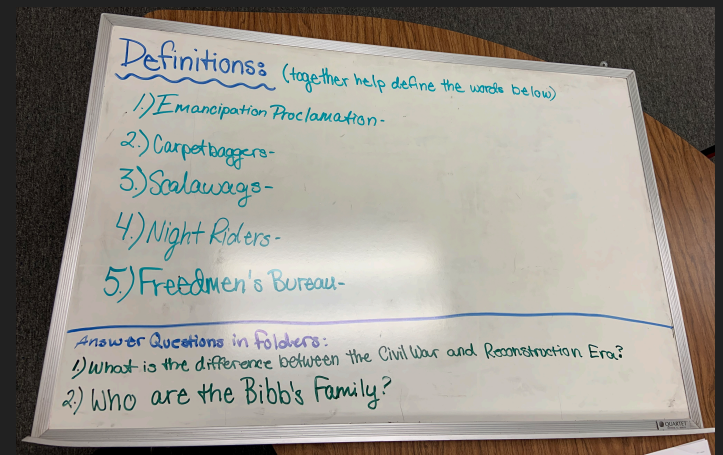
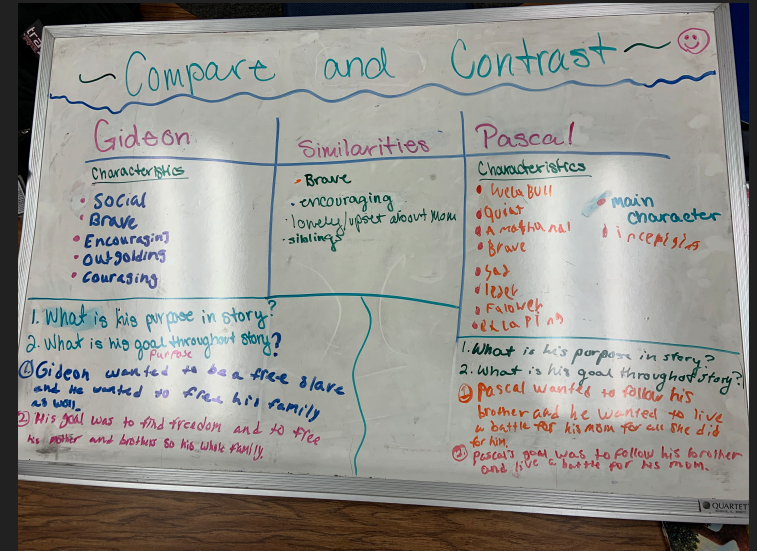
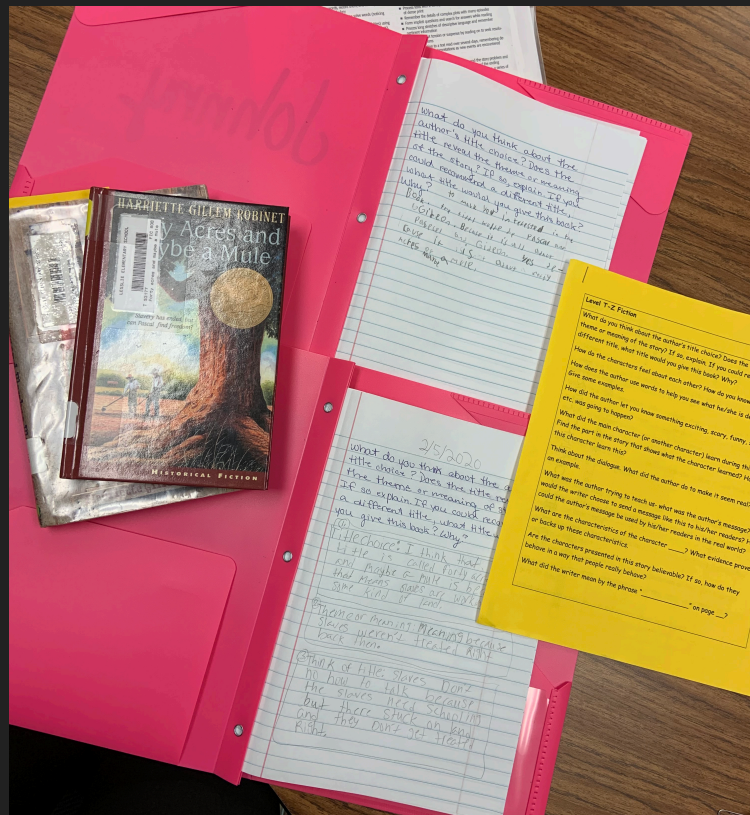
## Things I Helped do or set up





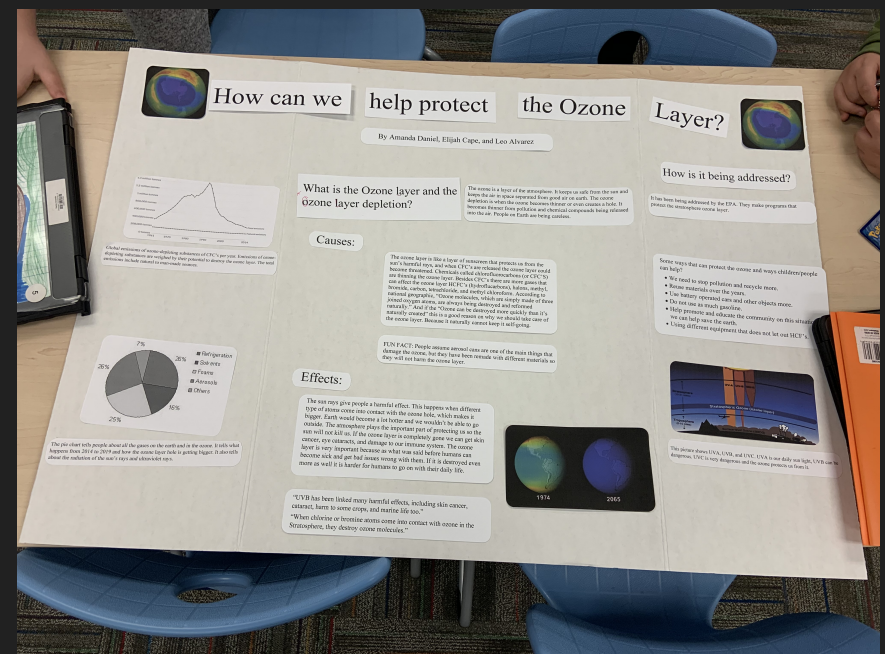
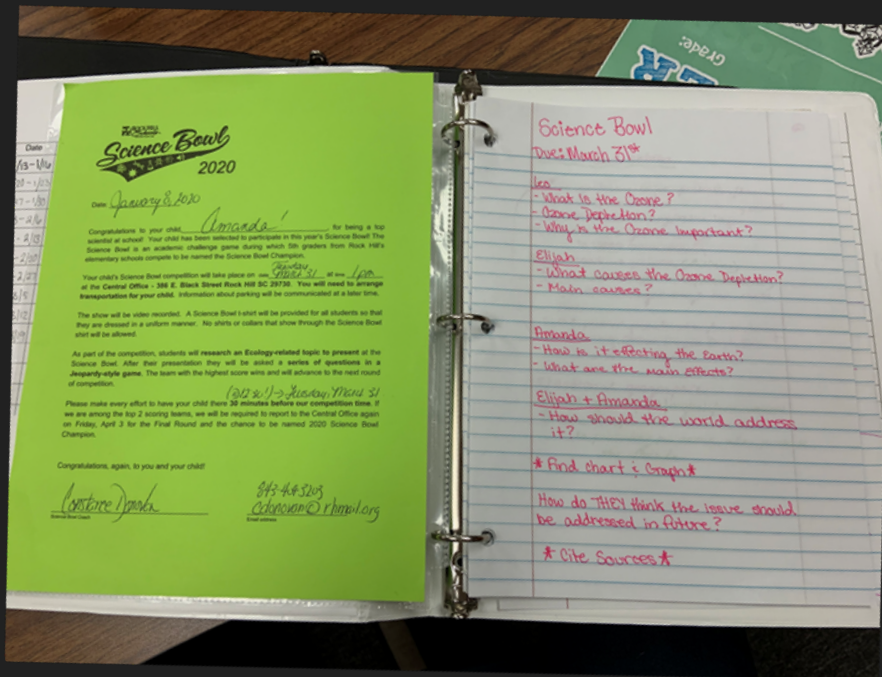
I had two kids during this activity and we would read different level books to help them comprehend and understand what they were reading. To the right you will see we were reading Forty Acres and Maybe a Mule.
