

# APPLIED TECHNOLOGY CENTER

## DRIVING/RIDING POLICY

1. Only Rock Hill High School and South Pointe High School students with sophomore status or above may receive parking stickers.
2. Each student driving to the Applied Technology Center must register his/ her car. Driving registration Forms may be obtained in ATC "A" office or from your teacher. The form must be completed and signed by student along with parent. All Driving Registration forms must be turned in to "A" office at ATC along with your RHH or SPHS hangtags.

**PARKING STICKERS** will be issued by the office and placed on the RHH/SP Hangtags and displayed at all times while on the ATC campus.

3. Students shall exit their vehicles immediately after arrival and park in the designated area. Loitering inside vehicles and student parking lot is strictly prohibited.
4. Students are not permitted to return to their vehicles during class or during class change without consent of their assigned teacher and administrator.
5. Only the student to whom the sticker is issued may use the sticker. Parking permits are not transferable.
6. Vehicles without a properly displayed and valid sticker are subject to towing at the expense of the vehicle's owner.
7. Students shall not ride in the bed of trucks or on the exterior of any vehicle.
8. Students must abide by all State highway laws.
9. Pedestrians shall always be given the right-of-way while driving on campus.
10. Students must demonstrate safe, responsible driving when arriving and leaving the school. Campus speed limit is 5 mph.
11. All trash shall be disposed of in the proper receptacles. Not in the student parking lot.

Designated parking is available for vehicles with a handicap tag or license tag. Vehicles parked in these areas shall exhibit the proper hang-tag.

12. Students are **ONLY** permitted to park in the **student parking**. Parking anywhere else may result, in car being towed at the owner's expense.

14. Drivers are advised to secure vehicles and secure items inside.

**Riding or driving to school in a private vehicle is a privilege.** Violation of any school rule or regulation (i.e., cutting school, excessive tardiness) by students may result in temporary or permanent loss of driving/riding privileges.
