

What's the Big Deal about Reading (in Two Languages)?

This week is Read Across America Week and we will celebrate Dr. Seuss' birthday as well. It is a great time for us to emphasize the value of reading. But, does it really matter? Does it make a difference? As you can see from the chart above, kids who read for twenty minutes a day score so much better on standardized tests. Kids who read more know more about any content area. They also are better writers because they understand how words work. They try out other author's styles and techniques in their own writing. They also play fewer video games (because they are reading!!) As an immersion school, we certainly value reading in English but we also want to encourage you to help expose your children to more books in Spanish and French. We have a Spanish selection of books in our Book Fair this week. We wish we had a French selection as well, but it is not available (through Scholastic in the US). Let Me Run Coaches Needed

Help start the Let Me Run program at Cherry Elementary this spring. Our spring season starts mid March and ends with the Let Me Run 5K on May 18th. The practices can be any two non-consecutive days of the week. Coaches can be runners / non-runners, male or female (but we prefer to have at least one male), experienced or not experienced. You just need a sincere desire to help boy improve their fitness and to build their character. Please consider coaching or recruit someone that you think would make a good coach!!!

Let Me Run is a character building / running program for elementary (fourth and fifth grade) and middle school boys similar to the Girls On The Run program. It is a nonprofit wellness program that inspires boys to be themselves, be active, and belong. With a comprehensive curriculum that applies the power of running, the program encourages boys to develop their psychological, emotional and social health, in addition to their physical health. Twice a week for seven weeks, two trained volunteer coaches lead an elementary or middle school team through practice. Designed to amplify confidence, self-expression, and respect for others, each practice includes a lesson from the Let Me Run curriculum that incorporates running, games and activities. Each fall and spring season culminates in a 5K race festival that celebrates the boys' personal growth.
