




Is Immersion Right for Every Child?

We were blessed to host 38 visitors on Wednesday from the 7th Annual International Conference on Immersion and Dual Language Education that was in Charlotte. I was able to attend Friday's sessions as well. Over and over, I heard the question, "Is immersion right for every child?" Parents often ask if there is a particular kind of child who does or does not do well in immersion. Here is the answer. **1. Immersion is not good for one type of child.** If a child has a receptive language disorder where he scrambles words that he hears, immersion will be difficult (but it is still possible with extensive accommodations.) This is the kind of child whose brain scrambles her first language so adding another one can be very frustrating. This kind of disability is very, very rare. 2. Immersion is right for all other children (and I do mean **ALL.**) That includes children with learning disabilities, those with behavior problems and those who may be on the autism spectrum. Children from poverty or wealth benefit. Kids whose first language is English or Spanish are successful. Kids who are African American, Hispanic, Caucasian, Asian and every other ethnic group can be immersed. Researchers Wayne Thomas and Virginia Collier contend that dual language immersion closes achievement gaps for all learners (http://www.thomasandcollier.com/assets/jncl-nclis-white-paper-on-dual-languageeducation.pdf). They assert that students of any demographic are much better off in immersion classes than English only classes. The Rand Corporation funded a research study that found similar results that immersion benefitted all students (https://www.rand.org/pubs/research_briefs/RB9903.html) While student learning problems may not be completely "fixed" by immersion programs, students make better gains than they

would in monolingual programs. Simply put, we believe immersion enables all students to

achieve at high levels in their learning. Deeply acquiring a second language is icing on the cake.
