I had the privilege this season to be a mentor for a player on the Winthrop Men's Basketball Team. Over and over, I heard Coach Kelsey and the players say the same things each week in their locker room. These words resonated with me as a principal, teacher and as a dad. They may be helpful for you to consider as well. 1. "We are the window through which the world views Winthrop University." Wearing a Winthrop jersey reflects on the university as an organization. We all represent something. It could be our school. It could be our workplace. It could be our church or civic club. It could be our family. Our children need to understand that what they do reflects on the larger group. It is not just about us as we grow up. 2. "Turn the page." Whether it was a great win to celebrate or an agonizing loss from which to learn, Coach Kelsey constantly reminded his guys that they had to turn the page to focus on the next game. It is easy to get stuck on our victories or defeats in the past and miss the opportunities that are in the present. There is always a time when we need to "turn the page." 3. "Look who made a difference." After a game, coaches quickly pointed out the contributions of the scout team and managers just as much as the players who scored points. There are so many who play a part in a team's success and every person matters. When our children sit the bench or play second fiddle on a team, it is so important for us to remind them that their contribution matters. No one wins by themselves. 4. "1-2-3 Team, 4-5-6 Family" Win or lose, players gather together and do this chant before going their separate ways after a game. A team is a group of people working to achieve a common goal. A family is where you belong. Winthrop coaches want their players to know that they are more than a team. This is their family who loves and cares for them no matter how they played. Kids need to know that they belong no matter what their performance is. I am so blessed to see these same values displayed in our classrooms and halls every day at Cherry Park Elementary. As we move ahead, we hope that our children will not only say many of these same things, but that they will show them in their actions. Thank you for all the ways you model these truths to and for our kids.

Let Me Run Coaches Needed

Help start the Let Me Run program at Cherry Elementary this spring. Our spring season starts mid March and ends with the Let Me Run 5K on May 18th. The practices can be any two non-consecutive days of the week. Coaches can be runners / non-runners, male or female (but we prefer to have at least one male), experienced or not experienced. You just need a sincere desire to help boy improve their fitness and to build their character. Please consider coaching or recruit someone that you think would make a good coach!!!

Let Me Run is a character building / running program for elementary (fourth and fifth grade) and middle school boys similar to the Girls On The Run program. It is a nonprofit wellness program that inspires boys to be themselves, be active, and belong. With a comprehensive curriculum that applies the power of running, the program encourages boys to develop their psychological, emotional and social health, in addition to their physical health. Twice a week for seven weeks, two trained volunteer coaches lead an elementary or middle school team through practice. Designed to amplify confidence, self-expression, and respect for others, each practice includes a lesson from the Let Me Run curriculum that incorporates running, games and activities. Each fall and spring season culminates in a 5K race festival that celebrates the boys' personal growth.
