



What Do Our Kids Learn from the Wax Museum?

On Friday, our fifth graders became "wax figures" who presented information about important people in history who made a difference. They did research, made a display, and dressed up as their person. They spaced themselves out in the cafeteria and visitors could "push their button" and the kids came to life and told about his or her character. This activity is so beneficial for our children. It requires them to use their inquiry skills to research a topic. They must do an oral presentation (which is one of the greatest fears of most people.) They have the chance to see life from a different perspective and literally stand in someone else's shoes. They also get to use their creativity to make their display and dress up for the part. We are so proud of their work. Their effort and perseverance on this major project is worth our applause. As I thought

about the Wax Museum this weekend, I wondered about something. How much are our kids "researching" us as teachers and parents each day? Are they learning how we make a difference or how we make a mess? Would they want to dress up and act like us or would they want to choose another person to emulate? I think the truth is that when their "button is pushed" by problems and adversity, we may have some indicator of our influence on them by what they say and do. All too often I know I forget that my daughter and son are always learning how to navigate their lives by watching how Jan (my wife) and I navigate ours. Our example will always be their greatest teacher.

Arrival and Dismissal Reminders

In order to help us have the most safe and secure arrival and dismissal, please keep the following in mind:

- 1. Changes in dismissal should be submitted in writing (as in a note) at the beginning of the day and sent with your child. There are times when teachers may not be able to check their email until the end of the day.
- 2. All early dismissals need to happen before 2:00. It is difficult to ensure our kids are going to the right places if staff members are having to go to two or three places to locate a child after 2:00 and get him/her to the right place.
- 3. When visiting Cherry Park for any reason, please bring proper identification such as your driver's license or official ID. Name badges or work badges are not appropriate ID.
- 4. In the morning, there is minimal traffic by our arrival time of 7:45. It is best for children to be in their classes by 7:40 and they are late at 7:45. Please know that our morning instruction has already begun by 7:40. After 7:45, parents need to sign in their children late at the main office at the Caswell entrance. The Cherry Road entrance door automatically locks at 7:45.
