

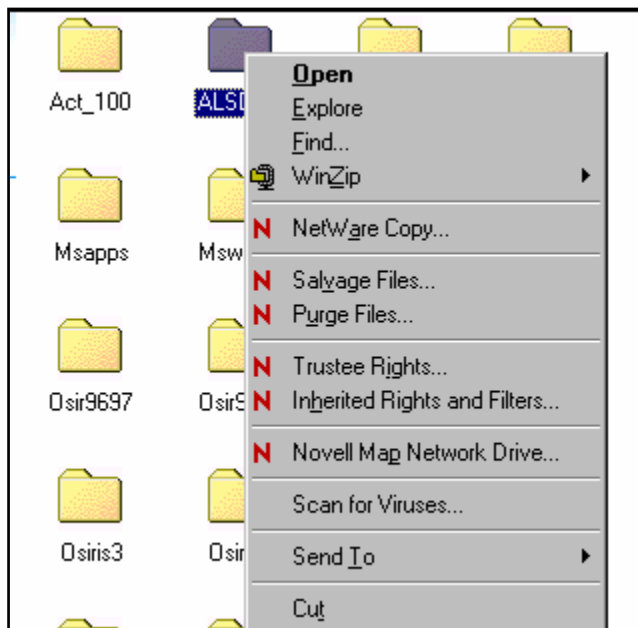
Nursing your AR back to Health!

Step One: Delete .tmp files

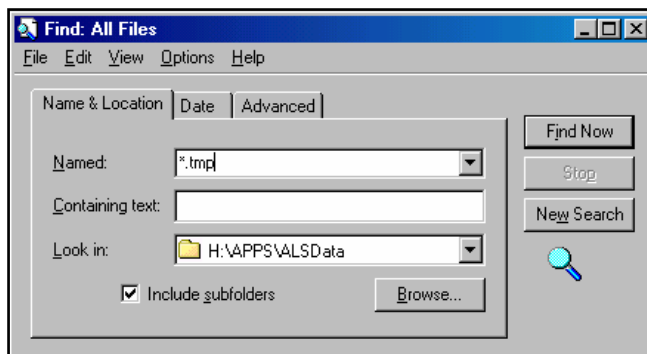
1. Double-click on My Computer.
2. Double-click on your school's Vol1. This is usually drive G, and would appear similar to:

Vol1 on NSES (G)
*example for Northside elementary

3. Double-click the APPS folder.
4. Locate the folder called ALSData.
5. Right-click on the ALS Data folder. A menu should appear similar to the one below:



6. Left-click on Find. The Find: All Files window appears.



7. In the named field, type in *.tmp . This will search your ALSData for any file that ends with .tmp .

8. Note!!! You may have several thousand files in this folder. Harriet, for example, had around 35,000 last week.

My advice would be to click on Find Now, let it run a second or two, then click on Stop. Reason?? If your computer finds more than 10,000 or so it may lock up as it runs out of memory.

9. You now have a listing of files that end with .tmp in your ALSData folder. Look over the list briefly to make sure only .tmp files are included.
10. From the Edit menu, choose Select All. All of the .tmp files should highlight.
11. Hit your delete key on your keyboard.
12. Verify the delete.
13. Run through the process again if you hit the Stop key. Repeat until no .tmp files show up in your search.

Step Two: Run the AR Data Doctor.

1. Double-click on My Computer.
2. Double-click on your school's Vol1 folder.
3. Double-click on the APPS folder.
4. Double-click on AR5.
5. Find the file named AR5DataDr.exe. It will have a little red cross symbol as its icon.
6. Double-click on this file. It should find your data source (ALSData). Choose to repair all.
7. Let it run. Close when finished.
