Video Requirements:

Videos may be submitted in any of the following categories: Spoken word, poem, song, drama, or playing of instrument.

Deadline: February 8, 2021

Videos must be submitted to crcrockhillartcontest@gmail.com.

Criteria:

Video can NOT be longer than two minutes.

The subject for all entries must fit the theme for this year's Black History Month Program: "Harlem Renaissance: The Manifestation of Literature, Art, Stage Performance, & Music in the African American Culture"

Black History Month Art Contest Guidelines

Teachers are encouraged to ask students to research African Americans' influence during the Harlem Renaissance and their impact on society, the world, and/or the local Rock Hill community to provide inspiration and relevancy to student video submissions. Examples of African American writers, poets, actors, musicians, artists, dancers, and performers during this era include: Langston Hughes, Zora Neale Hurston, Paul Robeson, Duke Ellington, Bessie Smith, Billie Holiday, Louis Armstrong, Aaron Douglas, Bobby Plair, Sr., Trina Ricks, and Garrison Gist.

- Videos should be submitted via email.
- Principals will need to select an Art/Drama/Theater Contest Coordinator, preferably an art, graphics, or drama teacher.
- Students may only submit one (1) video within the Oratory Contest.
- Each submission must include a completed copy of the Consent Form signed by the specified parties and Artist's Statement.
- Feel free to use video editor programs or apps (such as Splice, Quik, TikTok, Instagram Reels, etc.).
- Winning videos may become the property of the Rock Hill Community Relations Council and as such may be used, copied, and displayed by the Council for promotional/informational purposes.
- The Council reserves the right to not recognize winners should the category lack quality submissions.

General guidelines for all video submissions:

- The video should not be longer than two minutes.
- Video content should be inspired by or from the Harlem Renaissance era.
- Video content can be original work or originate from the Harlem Renaissance era.
- All videos must include an "Artist's Statement" and title. This statement is a brief, written description of your work to give the viewer understanding. Be sure to relate it to the theme of this program. This should be typed and emailed along with the video. It should be a few sentences to a short paragraph in length.

DISQUALIFYING FACTORS:

- Video may be disqualified if it lacks any of the aforementioned criteria.
- Incomplete Consent Form (not signed by all specified parties).
- Video is longer than two minutes.
- There is no Artist's Statement.
