WHAT ARE WE LEARNING IN 4th GRADE?

Reading- We are focusing on researching a topic of our choice. That includes tackling more complex text, vocabulary, and structures. We will also be summarizing, making inferences, making conclusions, and more.

Writing- We are publishing our informational book, and then we will shift to our new project. We will be researching a topic of our choice to write an informational report. We will be learning how to format a report. Then, we will choose our report or informational book to create a powerpoint presentation.

Math- We are finishing our algebra unit. This involves patterns, word problems, and multi-step word problems. We have been learning about this all year. Our next unit is fractions. We will learn how to make equivalent fractions, how to add/ subtract fractions with like denominators, and multiplying fractions by a whole number. We will be doing this by solving word problems and using pictures to help us solve.

Science- We just finished our unit on the moon. Our new unit is about the Earth rotation and revolution. We learn about the seasons and cycle of day and night. Astronomy instruments help scientists study space including: telescope, astrolabe, sextant, and compass. Our last astronomy unit is on the planets and constellations.
