WHAT ARE WE LEARNING IN 4th GRADE?

Reading- This quarter we will shift our focus to literary analysis. We will learn about point of view, author's craft, and figurative language (simile, metaphor, hyperbole, and more).

Writing- We are finishing our reports and beginning to prepare for our presentation on our topic. Then, we will move to literary analysis. This is combining many of the skills we learned in essays and informational reports.

Math- We are still learning about fractions. This unit focuses on adding/subtracting fractions with like denominators. Adding and subtracting mixed numbers, which may include changing an improper fraction to a mixed number. We will also be multiplying fractions by a whole number and analyzing line plots with fractions.

Science- We are finishing our astronomy unit by studying the 8 planets (rocky and gassy), constellations, and comparing sun/ moon/earth. Then we will begin our next unit on light. We will learn about different aspects of light: reflection, refraction, absorption, prisms, spectrum, transparent, translucent, and opaque.

Social Studies- We have learned about how the United States expanded westward with the Louisiana Purchase, Florida purchase, Oregon Treaty, Annexation of Texas, and Mexican Cession. As new states and territories were added to the United States the question of whether to have slavery in those new states were decided. This led to arguments between the north and the south. First we will study the differences between the north and south. We will also learn about 6 abolitionists: Harriet Tubman, Sojourner Truth, Harriet Beecher Stowe, William Lloyd Garrison, Fredrick Douglass, and John Brown.

Leader In Me- Our habit this month is Habit 6: Synergizing. We will focus on celebrating differences and teamwork.
