## WHAT ARE WE LEARNING IN 4th GRADE?

Reading- We started reading non-fiction by realizing we need to look at non-fiction differently than non-fiction. We look at what surprised us, what the author thought we knew, and what changed our thinking. We are learning about non-fiction features (table of contents, glossary, index, headings, bold type, captions, graphic sources, and more) & signposts that help us to stop and think when reading non-fiction (Numbers & Stats, Quoted words, Extreme Language, Word gaps, and Contrasts & Contradictions). We will also be looking to find the central idea and details!

Writing- We are beginning a new unit on opinion essays. We learned essays have a certain form. We began prewriting by using boxes and bullets. Next, we will be making sure we have strong evidence for each reason.

Math- We are learning how to solve multi-digit multiplication by using strategies to solve. We have a test next week. Our next unit will be on counting collections of money. Then, we move on to geometry!

Science- Weather, Weather everywhere! Our unit on weather includes: atmosphere, water cycle, clouds, severe weather, weather instruments, and weather patterns.

Social Studies- Now that explorers have claimed land, each country has set up a colony: New Spain, New France, New Netherlands, and English colonies. We will focus on 3 main regions of the English colonies including: New England, Middle, and Southern colonies.

Homework--Reading Log 30 minutes each night

-Study guides should be studied nightly when given -Other HW will be written in agenda (math problems/ Word Study practice) -Homework is explained in class and students are often given time in class to begin and ask questions. - HW club is a reward
