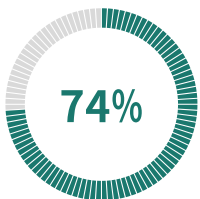
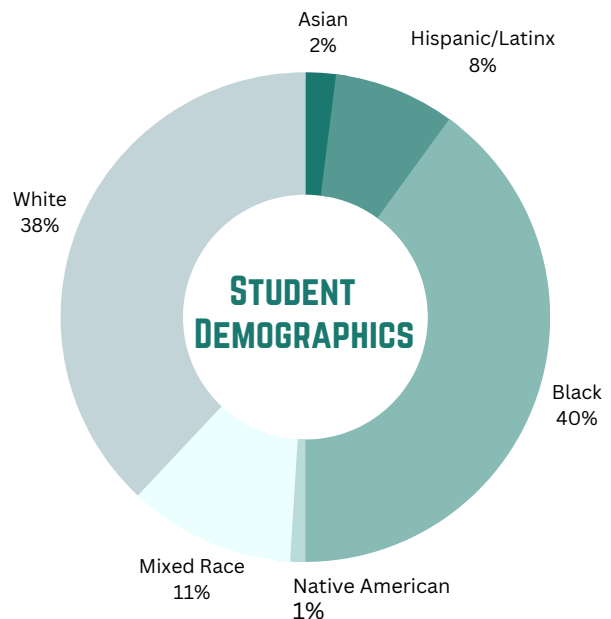
About Our Schools

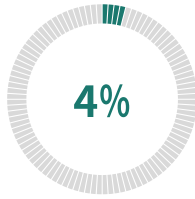

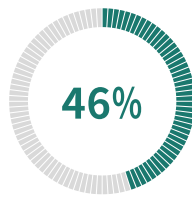
STUDENT ENROLLMENT 16,707



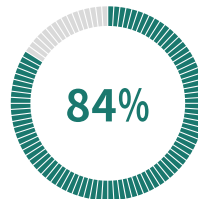
ATTENDANCE RATE



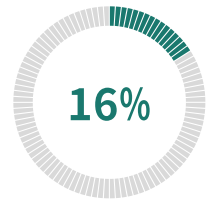
DROP-OUT RATE

In June 2021, the Board of Trustees approved a balanced General Fund budget of approximately \$180.7 million for the year ending June 30, 2022 which included an expected use of fund balance of approximately \$3.5 million.

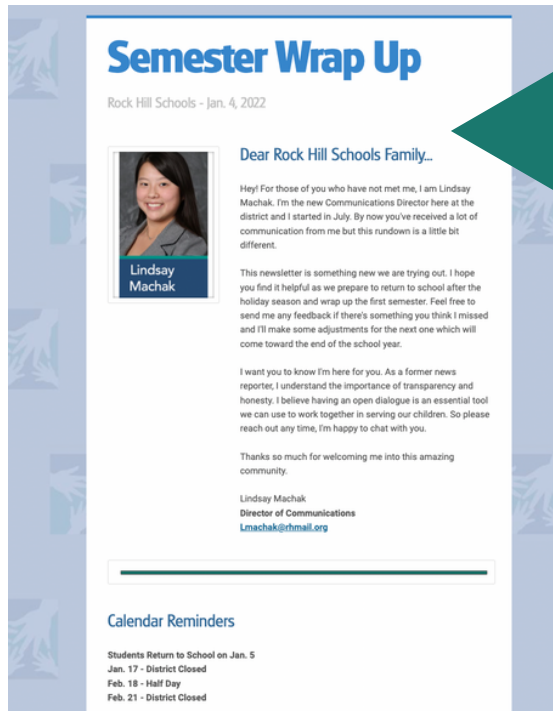

We are so proud two of our programs were highlighted nationally in the media including the newly launched Mental Health Department on GMA and Robotics Summer Camp on "U.S. News."

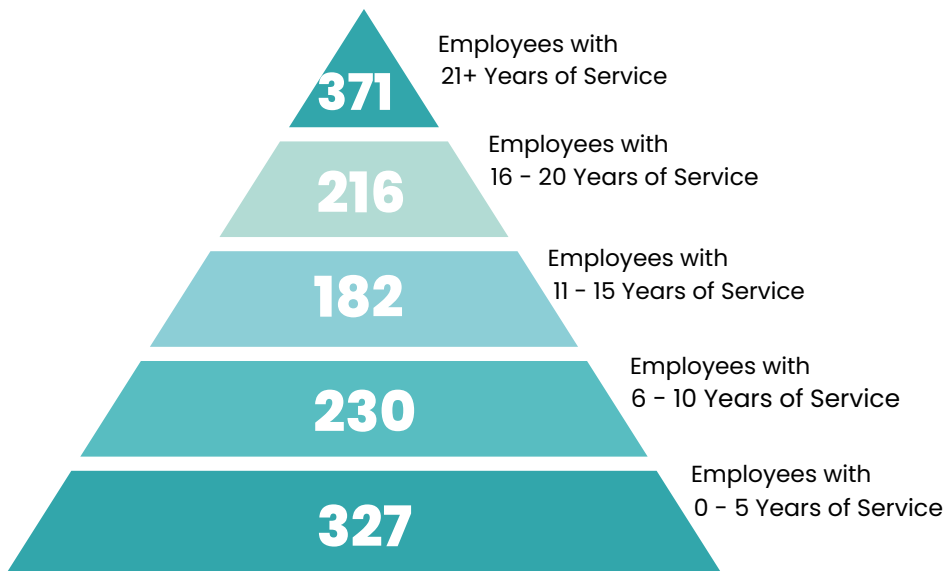


Meeting Dr. Schmolze

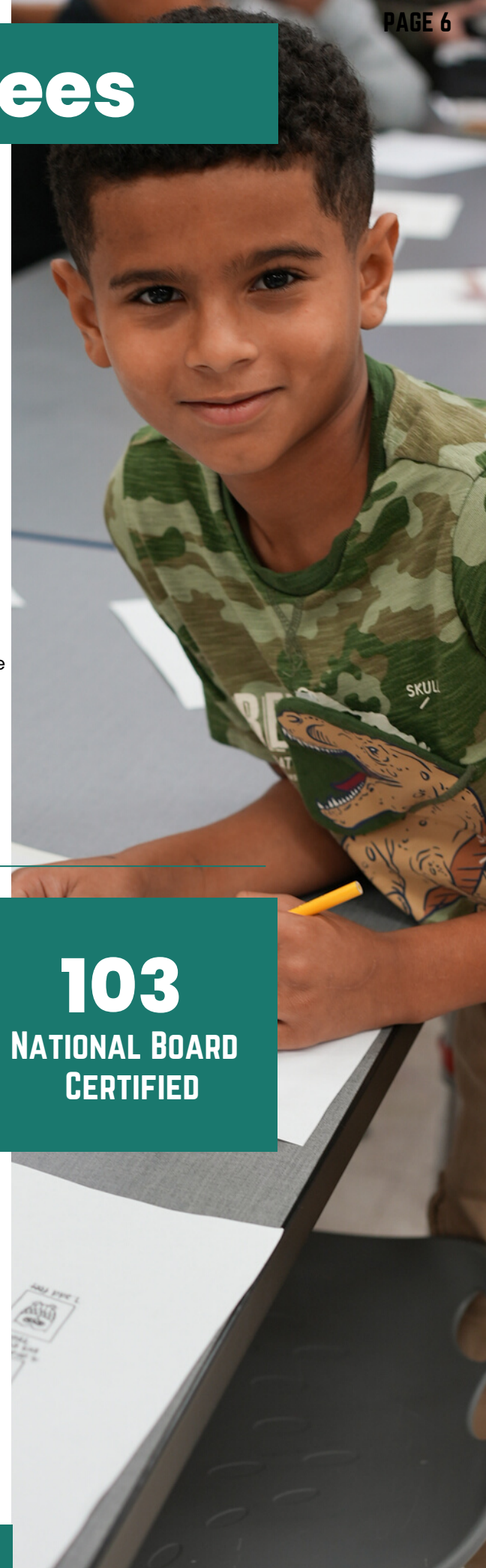

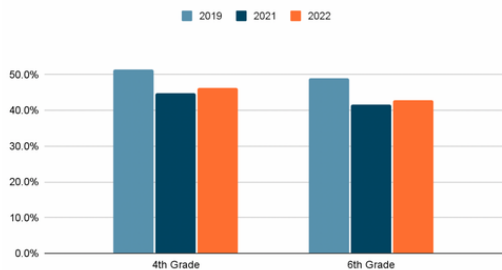

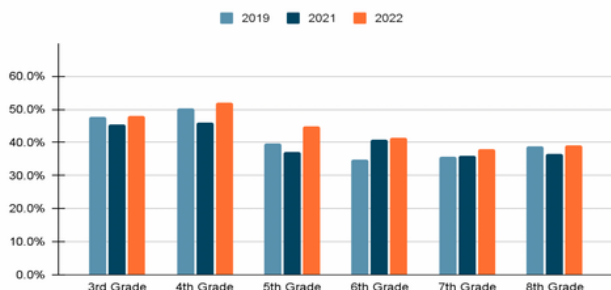

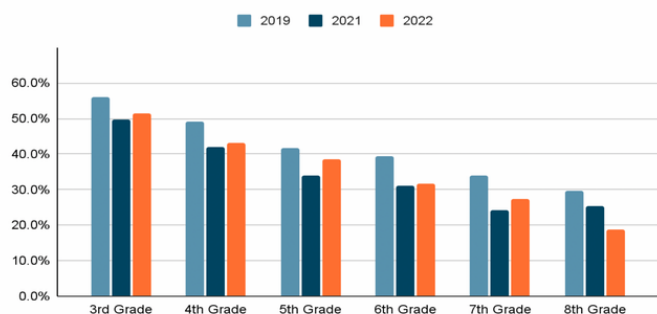
SCPASS - Science - % Meets or Exceeds

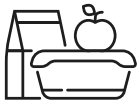

Safety & Security

The purpose of the Safety & Security Department is to provide a safe and secure environment for students, staff, district property, and other key stakeholders. Through a proactive approach including staff training and partnerships with local first responders, Rock Hill Schools works to ensure students, employees, and visitors to our campuses are safe. Some safety measures include: 2,110 cameras throughout the district, single-point entrance system in schools, access controlled doors, random safety screenings, and school safety audits by SCSBIT (SC School Board Insurance Trust).

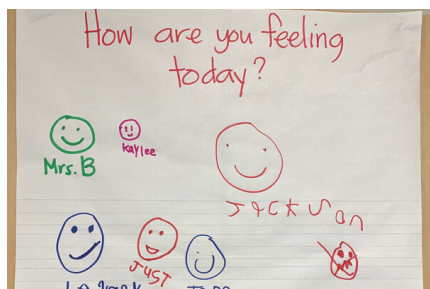
Strategic Planning, Engagement and Program Support

The department works to best ensure our students are present, in a healthy state physically, mentally, and environmentally to accept the opportunities, challenges, and rewards our educational system has to offer to support their student development.



Nursing Services

Provides daily support for student health needs in our schools to best ensure these needs minimally impact access to uninterrupted academic and social opportunities. We are proud of the success of our COVID-19 Call Center, COVID-19 daily dashboard updates, and the in-school testing of COVID-19 for families and employees. The COVID-19 call center answered 914 calls during the timeframe March 2022 - July 2022 with 894 calls answered in 300 seconds.



Mental Health

In Fall 2021, Rock Hill Schools became the **first in the state** to launch a Mental Health department! We have nine full-time licensed mental health therapists. In addition, it is our fourth year with Behavior Management Assistants at every elementary & preschool and our second year with Crisis Management Assistants at every middle and high school. RHS also offers a Day Treatment Center with highly-trained individuals to serve those unable to function in a traditional setting due to severe trauma, neglect, or other serious mental health issues.



Student Services

Works directly with students and their families to remove barriers to access, participate and thrive in an unencumbered educational experience.

In Fall 2021, the Student Advisory was created and currently there are 15 student members. The members of the cohort learn about the different departments within Rock Hill Schools and provide valuable insight and feedback on important topics.
