

Summer Learning

My Books Summer Express Bundle:

- 5 high interest books
- Activity sheets that correspond to each book
 - One side is for the child to do “on my own”; other side is for family time.
- Summer Reading Journal... is for the child to use with other books he/she reads or is read to during the summer. There are activities for both fiction and nonfiction books.
 - Pre K and K are the same.
 - Grades 1 and 2 are the same.
 - Grades 3-5 are the same.
- Weekly Reader: Summer Express Workbook
- Colored Pencils and Post card. Students should bring their postcard to school on the first day after summer.

Weekly Reader: Summer Express Workbooks:

- Letter to Parents, p. 4
 - 100 practice pages with 2 practice pages for each day of the week, Monday through Friday.
 - Pre K: alphabet, numbers, colors, shapes, sorting letters, sounds, etc.
 - K: alphabet, numbers, colors, shapes, sorting, letters, sounds, etc.
 - Gr. 1: reading, writing, grammar, place value, addition, subtraction, etc.
 - Gr. 2: reading, writing, grammar, place value, addition, subtraction, etc.
 - Gr. 3: reading, writing, grammar, place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, etc.
 - Grades 4 and 5: reading, writing, grammar, division, multiplication, fractions, decimals, etc.
 - Weekly incentive chart, certificate, stickers (last page in the book)

- Skill building Activities for Any Time pp. 6 and 7:
 - Find Real Life Connections
 - An Eye for Patterns
 - Journals as Learning Tools
 - Promote Reading at Home
 - Let your child catch you reading.
 - Have a family reading time.

Each week of activities is color coded with stickers provided and certificates for each week:

- Help Your Child Get Ready: Week 1, page 9
 - Ideas to enjoy
 - Skills you are working on
- Incentive Chart: Week 1, p. 10
 - Put a sticker to show you completed each day’s work. Certificate is for the completion of the week’s activities.
- Activity pages for the week, p. 11-20.

The next week’s activities begin with the same outline as listed above but with a different color coded sheets.

REMEMBER: An answer key is on pages 129 -142. You will want to remove this BEFORE your child begins. A Certificate of Outstanding Achievement for completing the workbook is on p. 143.
