Incremental improvement efforts continue to be made to the repairs process for Middle and High School laptop computers, following last semester's parts shortages from the manufacturer, a supply chain issue. Current status of this process is:

Inventory of laptop devices, grades 7 – 12: 8,027

Open laptop repair orders (parts on order): 212

Open laptop repair orders (image and return to schools): \_\_\_\_\_\_51

Total open repair orders as of February 20, 2017: 263

Availability rate (1 – (open orders/inventory) x 100%): 96.7%

Middle school students currently without a spare device assigned:

Castle Heights: 2
Rawlinson Road: 4
Saluda Trail: 4
Dutchman Creek: 8

The repair time for devices varies significantly depending on the type of the repair:

Major hardware repair orders: One to three weeks, depending on parts availability and
determination of warranty or accidental damage insurance coverage vs. deliberate
damage by the student. This can require time to investigate with the student and teacher.
In these cases, however, the student is issued a spare device for the duration of the repair.
Riverside Technology provides the three year accidental damage and warranty work for

- HP. While taking significantly longer during last semester's parts shortage at HP, the majority of these orders are now completed within one week.
- Minor troubleshooting (settings and software) repair order: The majority of these repairs
  involve leaving the device with the technician on site and repairs are completed the same
  day, or next day. In most cases a spare device is not issued for this type repair. In
  addition to our in-house staff, BridgeTek Solutions also helps with troubleshooting for
  non-hardware issues.

Reasons for reported long length of time for repairs and availability of spare devices have been investigated. While some longer lead-times are still due to parts availability and receipt, a number of other causes has also been observed, including:

- Students have been slow (days) to return spare units and pick up their original assigned laptop when called their device's repair order is complete. This directly impacts the number of spares available.
- In the case of troubleshooting orders, students sometimes delay in picking up their repaired device, which appears as an extended period of time without a device.

The ongoing repair and maintenance of this large inventory of devices can and does result in a small number of cases where the student may not have access to a district-issued device for a short period of time. It is the goal of the Technology Department to minimize this time. While our current availability rate is the same or better than many other benchmark districts, our team of in-house and vendor technicians will continue to partner with school leadership, teachers and our students themselves to ensure productive learning can occur each day.
